

The Difference between the CertEd and ProfGrad

All of the above courses are awarded by the University of Huddersfield (UoH) and are the full teaching qualification for those wanting to teach in adult (Lifelong Learning) education. All courses are equivalent to the Level 5 Diploma in Teaching (DiT) (formerly DET, DTLLS) that is offered by some colleges.

The Certificate in Education (CertEd) and ProfGCE (Professional Graduate Certificate in Education) have been written by the University of Huddersfield (UoH) to take account of the relevant Occupational Standards. All courses lead to Qualified Teacher Learning & Skills (QTLS).

Working in Schools	All qualifications lead to QTLS which is recognised by the Department for Education (DfE) to allow appropriate persons (e.g. also holding a National Curriculum based Degree) to work as a qualified teacher in a school. The Lifelong Learning PGCE should not be confused with the Secondary Schools based Post Graduate Certificate in Education (PGCE) and anyone that has a strong desire to teach in a school should probably contact a university directly to look at school based qualifications. School teachers are generally required to have Qualified Teacher Status (QTS).
