

Interior Systems Installer (Drylining Pathway) (ST0388)

Level 2 Apprenticeship

Overview

This occupation is found in the Construction and Built Environment industry including new-build, renovation, and refurbishment. It is a specialist contracting occupation largely involved in the construction of partitions, walls and ceilings.

Expected course duration

27 months

- **September.** However you will be able to start the work based learning element at any time throughout the year.

When can the apprentice start employment?

When offered job role and start date agreed with employer.

When can the apprenticeship training start?

As soon as Apprentice starts employment. Arrangements will be made to start apprenticeship and college delivery

Course content

- General principles of building design and regulation in construction
- Methods to install dry lining systems to metal and stud partitions, framed wall linings, frame and frameless beam and column encasements
- Health and safety, occupational health and mental health in constructions
- Selection and calculation of quantities, materials and equipment using setting out drawings
- The tools and equipment used in Drylining
- The different methods of installation and removal used in drylining
- The different types of drylining systems
- The methods to form openings and junctions

Entry requirements

Grade requirements...

- Level 2 Functional Skills Maths and English
- GCSE grade 4 and above Maths and English

Other requirements...

Essential:

- Level 1 Equivalent or Grade 3 and above Maths and English

What training is required in the workplace?

- Learning a variety of skills to enable the apprentice to be able to develop and complete their Apprenticeship and EPA
- 20% off the job training
- College attendance
- Regular 10/12/week Meetings with Training Coordinator, Manager and Apprentice to discuss progress and set SMART targets throughout apprenticeships
