

Countryside Worker (ST0408) Level 2 Apprenticeship

Countryside Workers carry out specific environmental and conservation tasks and they will also be clear about how practical conservation work interacts with the productive and recreational use of the countryside, including allied farming (livestock and crop production) and sporting activities (most commonly fishing and shooting) and how these relate to countryside management practices.

Expected course duration

15 months.

Any time of year.

When can the apprenticeship training start?

As soon as employed.

As part of this apprenticeship you will develop knowledge, skills and behaviours linked to:

- Health & Safety
- Communication
- Operating and maintaining machinery
- Identification and nomenclature of common Flora and fauna
- Vegetation control
- Survey and mark out site for features
- Construct and/or maintain site furniture
- Managing habitats
- Boundary construction and repair
- Problem solving
- Shadow and support colleagues
