

Early Years Educator (ST0135) Level 3 Apprenticeship

Overview

Early Years Educators, and other job roles such as nursery nurse and childminders, are highly trained professionals who play a key role in ensuring that young children learn and develop well and are kept healthy and safe. They work in a range of settings including full day care, children's centres, preschools, reception classes and as childminders. They may either be working on their own or supervising others to deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) requirements set by Government for the learning, development and care of children from birth to 5 years old.

Expected course duration

18 months

Course content

The apprenticeship covers a range of Skills Knowledge and Behaviours. Whilst studying you will be supported throughout the programme to develop:

First Aid

- Planning and supervising activities that are initiated by children and led by adults, tailored to meet the needs and interests of each child.
- Supporting children in developing their numeracy and language skills through games and play.
- Fulfilling key person responsibilities to ensure each child feels safe and secure.
- Utilizing observation skills to support each child's development and shape their learning experiences.
- Meeting the personal care needs of individual children, including feeding, changing nappies, and administering medicine.
- Collaborating with colleagues, parents, caregivers, and other professionals to address the unique needs of each child.

- Practitioner in reception classes in primary schools
- Pre-school worker
