

Craft Bricklayer (ST1334) Level 3 Apprenticeship

Overview

The role of Bricklayer involves laying bricks, blocks and other types of building components in mortar to construct and repair walls, foundations, partitions, arches and other structures.

The construction industry is a vital part of the British economy – it employs around 3 million people in the UK! The government plans to build more homes in the future, meaning that this is a growth sector, providing many opportunities.

What training is required in the workplace?

- Regular 10/12/week Meetings with Training Coordinator and Apprentice to discuss progress and set SMART targets throughout apprenticeships
